- 1. The respected author must confirm that his/her paper is a contextualised paper
- 2. A section on literature review would be very much appreciated

3. The introduction must include some respected authors/co-authors who have contributed in this sphere on women Arab literature

- 4. The list of references is obscure and not very friendly
- 5. Conclusion and Recommendations instead (on page 26)
- 6. A brief comparative study with other Arab countries would be highly appreciated.
- 7. Key words need no underlying

8. Where this study has been conducted is a real mystery: the country and location would be most welcome because not all Arab women suffer from discrimination. India is not a Muslim or Arab country but I strongly believe that Muslim women fully enjoy most of their fundamental rights.

9. A distinction must be made between Arab countries and Muslim countries: both are not the same.

10. The respected author failed to mention the (very important) role of the legislator to pass laws and legislations to protect Arab women highlighting the importance of the Constitution to impose constitutional rights to all citizens, and the doctrine of separation of powers.
